
We are calling on Congress to:

MORE CARE

- People who didn't get needed doctor care due to cost dropped by nearly 2% in two years
- People who didn't get needed dental care due to cost dropped by more than 2% in two years

IMPROVED QUALITY & CONSUMER PROTECTIONS

- · Coloradans have coverage for pre-existing conditions
- Colorado kids can stay on their parent's insurance until they are 26 • Preventative care is free
- 90 clinical practices across Colorado are participating in a \$65 million effort to improve the quality and efficiency of care

HELP FOR RURAL AREAS

• 235,000 Coloradans use Connect for Health Colorado for insurance • 17% are in rural counties • Half receive subsidies • Medicaid covers 182,000 people or 26% of residents in 47 rural counties • In 9 of those counties Medicaid covers 40 percent or more • In Costilla County, Medicaid covers 56%

ECONOMIC BENEFIT

- The cost of uncompensated care fell from \$699 million in 2013 to \$320 million in 2014
- Medicaid expansion created 31,074 jobs, increased economic activity by \$3.8 billion and raised average annual household earnings by more than \$600
